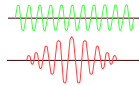




## Some Websites

Brrrr!! What happened with the weather? In case no one noticed, winter has arrived and with it, no more flight training on a regular

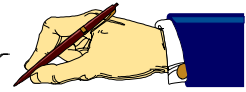

## President's

## Corner



Since this is the first newsletter of the new year, I would like to take this opportunity to welcome everyone to "CMA 2002". As your elected president, I will do my best to make this a fun-filled year full of flying and other model aviation related activities. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank last year's officers and all of those who volunteered to help in other ways for their time and effort to keep this club going strong.

First, a little about myself for those of you who don't already know the story. It all started in 1983 when my best friend's brother bought him an airplane kit. If I remember correctly it was a Sig Kadet. We built the airplane together and learned a lot in the process. Unfortunately at the time there was no club and no instructors in the area so we tried to teach ourselves to fly. Needless to say we didn't have much success. Undaunted by our lack of progress in learning to fly, I decided I wanted to have my own airplane. I proceeded to the local hobby store about 30 miles away and bought the kit that the person behind the counter recommended. It was the Midwest Sweet Stik. I built the kit and then spent the next couple of years trying to get the thing to fly and spent many hours in the shop rebuilding the fuselage after all the crashes. In 1986 I joined the Navy and that ended my flying for the next six years although I still maintained an interest in the hobby. In about 1990,

while I was still in the Navy, I bought a Goldberg Eagle 63 kit and put it together in about a week. It wouldn't be until I got out of the Navy two years later that the Eagle 63 got its first flight and I began again to teach myself to fly. The process went a little better with the Eagle 63 but in the end there was still many hours spent in the shop rebuilding parts of the airplane. I graduated from college in December 1996 and in January 1997 started my job here at Rockwell Collins (then called Rockwell International). During my interview I heard about the company-sponsored R/C club. At the new employee get-together that was held at the rec center I met a couple of members from the club that had a display table set up and got some information about how to join. I paid my dues at the March 1997 meeting and became a member of CMA. I spent the next couple of years in flight training under the watchful eye of the CMA flight instructors and soloed on May 29<sup>th</sup>, 1999. Since then I have been a regular at the CMA field and have logged many, many hours of flying time. It was a long 16 year road from building the first kit to finally soloing, but it was educational and a whole lot of fun along the way. I hope to continue this hobby for many decades to come. When I finally die at the ripe old age of 127 they will have to pry the Xacto knife from one hand and the bottle of CA from the other.



Now on to some club business. I apologize for letting last month's meeting run on so long, but I was trying to get a feel for what activities the club would like to do this year. There also were a few things I wanted to give the club a heads-up on and some beginning of the year items to take care of. I will try to keep a tighter reign on things in the future. If anyone has any ideas on events that we should have or any input into anything else, please don't hesitate to let me know. This is your club

In accordance with the "new tradition" of how the fun fly coordinators are appointed, I am also this year's fun fly coordinator. As such, I would like to have three fun flys. Anyone else out there get a flight in each month of 2001 for the All Season Flier patch? The club will be ordering patches for those that qualify, so notify Larry Kerns or myself if you earned one. I logged a total of 244 flights for the 2001 calendar year. For all of you 'One Season Fliers' out there, I encourage you to try flying throughout the year. This hobby is too much fun and the investment of time and money we put into building our planes and learning to fly them is too great to limit flying activities to just a few short summer months. Going out to the field once in a while in the winter to get in a few flights works wonders to relieve the monotony that we sometimes get into this time of year and is great for getting rid of cabin fever. Most of the time no special equipment is required, especially this year where there hasn't been much snow. If the snow does get to be a problem skis are readily available and easy to install. # Meeting Minutes

## 1 December, 2001

### Old Business

The meeting was called to order by CMA's President, Dave Shema. Only 5 members were in attendance.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Larry Kerns. Larry reported that the amount of company funding would not be known for the coming year until sometime after the first of November. To date, only Crist Rigotti had renewed his membership for the year. Mark Woytassek renewed at the meeting..

### New Business

Nominations for the club's offices were opened with the following results:

Following club officer nominations, Larry Kerns opened a general discussion about the possibility of acquiring some non-flying tools/construction aids for members to checkout and use. Some suggested items were a wing alignment jig, balancing jig, Top Flight's "how to" monokote video and so on. The idea was well received by those present and will be investigated.

In addition, Larry also suggested organizing a club plans library from models built by the members for reference. Mark Woytassek said he had liked this idea for quite some time and it will also be pursued as a possibility for the coming year.

Mark Woytassek brought up the idea of group buys throughout the year. He said that this was once a common event in the club. If someone needed a common item (for instance he needs ~10 rolls of ultra-coat), then a general call for a group buy opportunity would go out. The person calling the group buy would be responsible for gathering details about how much would be saved and arranging the buy with the vendor. Everyone in attendance thought this was a good idea.

Mark also suggested the possibility of a club trip to SIG.

The question came up as to whether the club still had access to company assets such as copying machines, especially for such things as copying model plan sheets. Dave Shema volunteered to check into this starting with Sandy Strike (our company liaison).

Dave was also going to check with Jamie Johnson on the progress made on the static airplane model (F14 Tomcat). Jamie has been working on a non-flying r/c model of the Tomcat for static display in the company cafeteria at main plant.

There was a discussion about starting the newsletter up again. As many of you know, our former long-time newsletter editor Jim Doty had to cease production of the newsletter because of time constraints (and since he was no longer a club member, this seemed reasonable). Larry Kerns volunteered to take over the newsletter but emphasized that the quality of the publication would be directly related to the participation from the membership in obtaining material to print. Larry stated that he had published a computer club newsletter for Rockwell Collins in Dallas for over 8 years. He will get in touch with Jim to effect the turnover.

# Meeting Minutes

10 January, 2002

## Old Business:

1. Dave Shema announced that he had made Cafeteria reservations for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursdays of the month for the remainder of the year.
2. July 4<sup>th</sup> meeting will be held on July 11<sup>th</sup> (2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday) instead.
3. Steve Plantenberg will obtain a date that the cafeteria is free for the CMA Beauty Contest. (not near a holiday weekend if possible!)
4. Steve also asked about interest in club participation in the Skyhawk's swapmeet on 24 Feb. The membership seemed to agree that if individuals wanted to participate, ok, but not funded by club.
5. Newsletter was not put out in December due to pre-holiday job commitments but will be put out in January.

## New Business:

1. The CMA membership in attendance made some decisions on club appointed positions:
  - a. Field Marshall: Mark Woytassek
  - b. Newsletter: Larry Kerns
  - c. Website: Dave Shema
  - d. Safety Officer: Jamie Johnson
  - e. Head Flight Instructor: TBA
2. AMA now has a new change required for the club's bylaws. We must have the changes in place by the end of this Calendar year in order to comply with the AMA deadline for existing clubs next year.
3. There were some general discussions about the coming year's budget.
  - a. Steve Plantenburg asked for a membership count as to the number of fun flies to host this year. The membership supported three, one in Spring, one in mid-summer and one in late

Fall. It was suggested that instead of a lot of expensive prizes that we provide fuel for all and a porta-potti.

- b. Larry Kerns brought up the subject of acquiring club “assessts” in the form of non-flying tools and construction aids as well as “how-to” videos such as the Top Flight monokote video for members to check out. The items would be checked out and managed in the same way that the woodworkers club does it (via the internet). Dave Shema had also suggested that we try to obtain a PC from the IT department to be used for club meetings for the flight simulator, etc. Larry Kerns took action items to contact IT about a PC and facilities about a place to store the PC and other assets, preferrably near the Main Plant Cafeteria.
- c. There will no longer be door prizes given away at the meetings
- d. Everyone decided that demos needed to make a comeback at the meetings. It was pointed out, of course, that member volunteers for demos was essential to that desire.
- e. Steve stated that we would need to have a budget planning meeting soon. No date was set.
- f. The club membership in attendance decided to have the Martinson’s Dinner in March. The exact date is still TBA. We also agreed to a general CMA club night out with the wives.
- g. Dave Shema moved to have Larry Kerns buy and keep in stock a reserve of commonly used patches from the AMA such as the all season flyer and date patches. Jamie Johnson seconded and the membership approved the buy unanimously.
- h. Larry Kerns asked all members to come by and show him their current 2002 AMA registration cards.
- i. There was a general suggestion about trying to get all of the area clubs (as many as 8) together to approach the city about a flying park or at least a decent field for the club’s to use. Various potential locations for the field were discussed. It was emphasized that this in no way impacts our current flying field use. This would merely provide an alternative field closer in. Dave Shema took an action item to talk to the Skyhawks about get something organized. Evidently, politics between area clubs may play a big part in this ideas success.
- j. Dave Shema won the door prize for the day. There will be no further door prizes given at the meetings.
- k. Doug Emerson moved to adjourn the meeting and Dave Shema seconded. Meeting was adjourned.
