Here's a recipe that will make a lot of people happy. It does contain coconut, so that might rule out some, but these are DELICIOUS cookies. They have 'just the right amount of everything'.

Killer Cookies

Mix and set aside:

- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp salt

Beat until fluffy:

- 1 cup shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar

2 eggs - add one at a time

Then add 1 tsp vanilla

Add flour mixture

Then add:

- 2 cups old fashioned oats
- 2 cups Rice Krispies
- 1 cup sweet flake coconut
- 6 ounces chocolate chips

Form balls of dough and bake @350 for 10 minutes until edges start to turn golden brown.

Cool on pan for 5 minutes.

(Cookies will continue to cook a bit more during this time.)
